## An Open Letter to the Youth of India

## Young Minds,

So the common youth like us are left to carry their political flags, march behind them and do all the hard work for the party and to merely obey the dictates of these leaders who think that they are feudal lords and the young people like us are their slaves. Since independence, this is the way things are carrying on where we youth are made to do all the work and yet we are the ones who are most neglected. We carry on working as slaves to the political leaders and they enjoy the fruits which essentially are result of our hard work and political acumen.

Do you want to remain forever a slave to the present political leadership? Do you feel that this leadership will let you grow up to attain any position of power? Do you think you can be a part of the decision making authority of the nation? Will you be able to contest and win elections from these political parties to be in the State Assemblies or in the Parliament? Do you think the present political leadership will make you significant ministries even if you win election by your own charisma? These are some of the questions which you need to ponder on.
